4. **Read 1 Timothy 6:17-19**
 - a. In our contemporary context, what classifies someone as being rich in this present age? Do you think you fall into this category? Why or why not?
 - b. What does this passage teach us about wealth? How does that contradict what the world teaches?
 - c. What do we learn about God in this passage?
 - d. According to Paul, what does it really mean to be rich?
5. Which is more difficult for you, giving your time or your financial resources? Why do you think that is? Why are both important to the work of the Kingdom? Why are both important to the

King's work in you?

6. What's one step you can take to grow in uncommon generosity? Close your time by praying together as a group for your growth in this area.
