

Week 2: God is Good and He is Faithful

Genesis 12:10-20 highlights the tension between humanity and God's faithfulness. Despite Abraham's lapse in faith, God remains steadfast in His promises, intervening to protect him and Sarah. This shows the importance of trusting in God's faithfulness even when faced with crises, demonstrating that God's sovereignty is not hindered by human failings. God is Good and He is Faithful!

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What stood out to you the most about Abraham's response to the famine? How does his reaction resonate with your own experiences of crisis or uncertainty?
- 2. How do you remind yourself of God's promises during challenging times? Are there specific verses that you find helpful?
- 3. Reflecting on your own life, can you think of a time when you experienced God's faithfulness during a difficult situation? How did that experience shape your faith?
- 4. Have you ever been encouraged by someone else's testimony of God's faithfulness? How can sharing our own stories of God's faithfulness impact others in our community?
- 5. How can we cultivate a deeper trust in God's faithfulness in our daily lives? What practical steps can we take to focus more on God's promises rather than our circumstances?
